1 CLUBHOUSE OPENING HOURS

Tea/Coffee available at all times during Clubhouse Opening Hours

2 Ordinary, House, Honorary and Temporary Members may introduce visitors to the Clubhouse in accordance with the following provisions:-

- (a) Only four visitors may be introduced by one person at one time, except in the case of a party living on board a yacht belonging to a Member, in which case this provision shall not apply.
- (b) No Member may introduce the same visitor more than twice in any one calendar month, unless the visitor is living on board the Member's yacht, in which case this provision shall not apply.
- (c) Any Member introducing a visitor shall enter in a book to be held for the purpose the date of the visit, his own name and the name and address of the visitor.
- (d) Any Member introducing a visitor shall be responsible for the obedience of the visitor to these Regulations.

3 BAR OPENING HOURS

Tea/Coffee available at all times during Clubhouse Opening Hours

- (2) No exciseable liquor shall be sold or supplied to any person under the age of eighteen years.
- (3) Persons under 14 are not allowed in the bar area during permitted hours.
- (4) No exciseable liquor shall be sold or supplied to any visitor in the Club premises unless on the invitation of and in the company of a Member.
- (5) No exciseable liquor shall be sold or supplied for consumption outside the premises on week days except to a Member on the premises and for his own consumption.
- (6) No Member of the Committee and no person employed in the Club shall have any personal interest in the sale of exciseable liquor therein or in the profits arising from such sale.
- (7) A tariff of charges shall be exhibited in the Clubhouse.

4 STAFF

- (1) The conduct of any Member of the Staff shall not be made a matter of personal reprimand by a Member, and any complaint shall be made to the Honorary Secretary who shall submit the complaint to the Committee at its next meeting thereafter.
- (2) No person shall give any gratuity to any Member of the Staff.

5 MEMBERS

Any Member on entering the Clubhouse may be requested by the Clubmaster to write his or her name in a book to be kept for the purpose.

6 DAMAGES

- (1) No person shall wilfully deface, damage, destroy or remove from the Club any newspaper or any other article belonging to the Club.
- (2) Any person inadvertently causing damage to any article belonging to the Club shall report the same to the Clubmaster and may be called upon by the Committee to contribute towards the making good of the damage.

7 DOGS

No dogs shall be allowed in the Clubhouse, except for Guide Dogs.

8 NOTICES

No notices or advertisements shall be placed in the Clubhouse except with the consent of the Committee.

9 SMOKING

In terms of The Smoking, Health and Social Care (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Prohibition of Smoking in Certain Premises (Scotland) Regulations 2006, smoking is prohibited in the Clubhouse. This includes changing rooms; oar, sail and engine stores and the enclosed area under the verandah and outside the changing rooms. Any Member or guest of a Member found in breach of this Law will, in addition to any personal penalty, be responsible for any financial outlay by the Club.

10 COMPLAINTS

Any complaint against these Regulations shall be forwarded in writing to the Honorary Secretary who shall lay the same before the Committee at its next meeting thereafter.
